Using art and the written word, their book invites people to visit the historic towns of Greenwich, Schuylerville, Saratoga Springs, Easton, Salem, and Cambridge.

Elizabeth and Barton Cockey live in Baltimore, Maryland, and Greenwich, where they enjoy antiquing, painting and gardening.
